EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT

Summer is almost over; the stags have just started to roar and the grape harvest has begun. What a fantastic time of the year but what lies ahead of us is any ones guess at the moment. On the 1st of March 2021 the Ministry for the Environment released the document "Net emissions and removals from vegetation and soils on sheep and beef farmland."

One study in the report estimates that woody vegetation on farms maybe removing between 63 to 118% of the gross agricultural emissions, showing that some farms are already there and some of us still have more to do. Whatever the final outcome will be is still not known and with most things farming we will have to adapt and change to carry on.

Whilst reading through the report I am reminded of the New Zealand Wine Industry and their drive to be carbon neutral. One of the wine companies we supply was the first major winery to be carbon zero certified. We were told that the consumer wants us to be sustainable and to have the lowest carbon footprint possible. All of this was achieved in a predominately machinery-based production system, where we ship our products to the other side of the world.

Throughout the whole process of turning grapes into wine there is one part of the process that accounts for almost 50 % of the total carbon output and when moves were made to change and reduce this to around 20% the consumer pushed back.

So, what is it that accounts for almost 50% of the carbon footprint of wine? It is the glass bottle. Who can remember when they sold wine in a plastic bottle? Not many people I'm sure would remember that.

Along with adversity comes the need for change and that is very real in the deer industry. The new formed China Velvet Coalition that will have three major velvet companies from New Zealand providing a greater impact in the market is a great example of that change response. This is a really positive outcome that has been supported by many different groups working together for the benefit of our industry.

VelTrak will also be coming to a deer shed near you this year with registration open from the 3rd May 2021 for farmers. VelTrak has been put through its paces and will be ready to go this coming velvet season. I hope that you don't leave it till the last minute like you normally would when you buy that special loved one their Christmas or birthday gift. Make sure you register early and it will make it so much easier.

All the best for the upcoming weaning season and whatever lies beyond that.

BLACK LABFLS FOR THE BEST VELVET

Black label whiskey. The All Blacks. The Black Ferns. Black label velvet.

Black will be the colour of the new velvet tags being introduced for the coming 2021/22 velvet season. The blue tags used during the last two seasons will no longer be accepted.



The tags, which will carry a UHF RFID chip as well as a barcode, will enable velvet to be rapidly tracked from the farm to the market (and vice-versa) as part of the new Ve⊓rak™ system.

At this stage farmers don't need to do anything with regard to VelTrak apart from ensuring they have a functioning email address. The action starts for farmers on 3 May, when on-line registration opens. Before that happens, they will receive an information pack from DINZ, followed by an email inviting them to register.

Deer vets (along with buyers and warehouses) are the first cabs off the rank for VelTrak registration, which opens for them on 6 April. To prepare vets for this, DINZ is holding webinars during March to bring them up to speed.

Basically, the role of vets won't change under VelTrak. They will still issue farmers with tags, but from next season they will need to do it on-line, on the VelTrak website.

Because the new tags link each stick of velvet from the vet, to the farmer, to the buyer, to the exporter, tags will not be able to be swapped between farms. The whole purpose of VelTrak is to provide this unbroken electronic chain that links individual sticks of velvet to a particular farm.

"In the first VelTrak season, overseas customers will be able to scan the barcode on a black tag and confirm that the stick comes from New Zealand and meets all our strict animal welfare and food hygiene standards. That's the basic traceability they are looking for," says DINZ markets manager Rhys Griffiths.

"Down the track, some customers will doubtless want to scan a stick and see a photo and a bit of a story about where the velvet comes from – the farm, the farmers and the deer. Once VelTrak is up and running, this something which, with appropriate permissions, we will likely explore.

"VelTrak is a black label product that has a big potential for building the NZ velvet brand in years to come."

DATA PROTECTION PROTOCOL IN PLACE FOR VELTRAK

VelTrak, the web-based velvet tracking system which will be in place for the 2021/22 season, has been designed from the ground-up to keep your information confidential.

A buyer won't be able to see who else you may have sold your velvet to. You, as a farmer, won't be able to see who else your buyer is buying from.

"It is a 'one-up, one-down' traceability system as required by our food safety laws," says DINZ QA manager John Tacon. "Buyers, warehouses and processors will only see data relating to an individual shipment from the farm or firm they received it from. An exporter who buys from an agent won't see the names of the farmers the agent bought it from."

When users log on to VelTrak they land in a part of the website that is specific to a category of user. For instance, only veterinary practices will be able to allocate velvet tags to farmers on VelTrak and only farmers will be able to approve draft eVSDs.

"In the normal course of events, third parties - such as MPI - won't be able to access VeITrak, Also

DINZ won't have the right to access data at will. No-one will be able to snoop around the system," says John.

However, if there is a biosecurity or food safety crisis, MPI has the legal power under food safety and other legislation to obtain information on the farm of origin of particular sticks of velvet. It may also request velvet that has come from a particular farm or passed through a particular premise to be traced, but it will need to make a formal request to DINZ or system registrants for this information.

DINZ itself will have the ability to access the system, but only under limited circumstances. These are defined in a protocol which will be published on www.deernz.org/VeITrak (http://www.deernz.org/VeITrak).

As for the VelTrak system itself, the software has been created specifically for the NZ deer industry by a company specialising in IT for the primary sector. Similarly, the scanners and barcode formats have been selected specifically for deer velvet with the help of a NZ company that is the global leader in UHF scanning technology. Ensuring security of data has been a key requirement for both suppliers.

HE WAKA EKE NOA UPDATE

The He Waka Eke Noa (HWEN) industry-government-Maori partnership continues to develop an on-farm pricing system for greenhouse gas emissions and carbon storage. In November last year HWEN held initial consultations with a range of industry reference groups (including deer farmers) and a further consultation was held in February with selected representatives from all the reference groups. These have provided valuable feedback for HWEN to incorporate into the pricing system and a pleasing aspect has been how consistent the messages have been from the different farmer and grower groups. The first significant requirement for farmers will be to know their greenhouse gas emissions number for their farm by the end of 2022. HWEN is evaluating a number of different tools that can report on deer emissions and once these are endorsed by HWEN, DINZ will be looking to assist deer farmers to estimate their on-farm emissions and stored carbon.



METSERVICE OUTLOOK



(/sites/dinz/files/Metservice%20march%20outlook.png)March signals the onset of meteorological autumn and it looks like the weather knows it. Whilst the month gets off to a warm start, there's plenty of wet weather around. Weather fronts will frequently run up the country bringing rain with thunderstorms likely too. Come the first weekend of autumn, it will start to feel very autumnal indeed. Winds shifting southwesterly will drag the temperatures down across the whole country. This shift will also mean that rainfall yields form passing fronts are lower than in the first week of the month. At the same time whatever remains of TC Niran which is currently in the Coral Sea may well run close to the upper North Island. It's too early to say how close just yet, so stay up to date with the forecast.

Expect the cool and unsettled southwesterlies to continue through to the middle of the month when high pressure looks likely to return. Building pressure in the northern Tasman Sea will shift winds westerly, bringing temperatures back to near normal for most of us. As the high becomes more established expect a much more settled fortnight to end the month, particularly for North Island.


